

Bear Meadows Natural Area

National Natural Landmark • 1965

Located within the Rothrock State Forest in the Appalachian Mountains, the area contains a bog surrounded by steep mountains and hiking trails. The bog, which covers 320 acres has been forming since the end of the last glacial period 10,000 years ago and is surrounded by an old-growth forest of boreal species typically found much farther north. nature.nps.gov/nnl/site.cfm?Site=BEME-PA

National Register of Historic Places • 1979

Headquartered at the Centre Furnace Mansion, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Mansion and Furnace Stack are available for tours. 
Penn State All-Sports Museum

National Register of Historic Places • 1971 One of Central Pennsylvania's unique and best preserved state-owned historical sites. Black Moshannon State Park Historic Districts

National Register of Historic Places • 1987 At the top of the Allegheny Plateau, the Black Moshannon State Park Historic Districts offer visitors a lake for swimming and canoeing, hiking


Rowland Theatre

Victorian Bellefonte National Register of Historic Places • 1977



The Grange Fair began in 1874 when local Grange members, encouraged by Leonard Rhone, gathered for a picnic and to launch the Grange Organization. 
Penns Valley Area Historical Museum/ Rudy-Corman Building
