### CENTRE COUNTY GENEALOGICAL RECORDS AND RESOURCES

The Centre County Historical Society is headquartered in the Centre Furnace Mansion in State College, PA, an historic house museum on the National Register of Historic Places. The mission of the Society is to help people understand, experience, appreciate and preserve our county's cultural and natural heritage. Our programming and preservation efforts support this mission. The Society has a limited collection of genealogy resources, but we do have some. We have a small staff, so it is helpful if you can call ahead and make an appointment so that we know you are coming and can collect any applicable information before you arrive. Small county historical societies and local history museums are often good places to begin researching your genealogy. They will generally have, to varying degrees, genealogical resources in their collections. But just as important, they often have collaborative working relationships with other local and state organizations that support genealogy research and can refer you to them.

**SPECIAL NOTES:** Please remember to email or call before you visit, preferably a few days in advance and especially if you are visiting from out of town. With small organizations, you may need to leave a message. Information found on internet search engines may not always be accurate, and is never complete when it comes to office hours versus research protocol or tour hours. When looking online, it is important to go directly to a site's website, but also wise to call or email the site. Better yet, email ahead with detailed information about what you are looking for so a volunteer or staff member can prepare for your visit.

Genealogical collections are most often maintained by small non-profit organizations that rely on membership and donations to operate. They may be managed by volunteers, or only have one or two paid staff, often limited hours, and only be open seasonally. Assume that an appointment is needed to do research, or at least appreciated, and will help the staff members or volunteers trying to help you. Some sites charge research fees if they are doing more than a quick search; ask what their policy is. Donations are always welcome and appreciated at small non-profit organizations.
