

Weathered stumps at the south end of Black Moshannon Lake now mark where Beaver Mills lumber Company turned a vast pine forest to lumber nearly 200 years ago. Much of the lumber went into a plank road built from Port Matilda to Tyrone.

Bituminous coa mines dotted the Mountainto Region. The

Bellefonte and Snowshoe Railroad brought coal down a series of switchbacks to Wingate and further railroad connections in the Bald Eagle Valley starting in 1859.

The first recorded exploration of Centre County was by Captain James Potter, a British army officer in 1759.



There were 19 iron furnaces and

forges in Centre County. Iron was

produced here from 1792-1921.


